## THE STORY

On September 18, 2015, at seventeen, Cameron was struck by a speeding car in Columbus, Indiana, while teaching a young neighbor to ride a longboard. He suffered a severe traumatic brain injury, lost a third of his skull, and spent two and a half weeks in a coma. At nineteen he founded Voice of TBI, Inc. He went on to graduate summa cum laude, earn his J.D. from the Indiana University Maurer School of Law as a Forrest E. Jump Scholar while raising triplets plus one, and become a licensed attorney by twenty-four.

He now practices personal injury and traumatic brain injury law at Schad Law, P.C. in New Albany, Indiana, alongside the same attorney who once represented him as a client. Licensed in Indiana and Kentucky.
